A Learning and Reflective Opportunity...



Jump Into Music

"Jump Into Music" is a non-profit ministry begun and carried out through Spanaway Lutheran Church. It allows low-income students to take music lessons for very reduced price, while still paying music teachers fair wage. (Other students can take lessons at regular cost.). Teachers are paid through the work "Jump Into Music" does to attain grants, and through concerts given a couple times a year by the board, with donations from such going to teacher payment.

We have two teachers and four students at this time, with more students interested!
